Financial Summary

2015/16 Budget Analysis

The Town Council's budgeted gross revenue expenditure for the year amounted to £1,071,775 and the Council is pleased to announce that a modest surplus will be achieved which will be reinvested to provide future services for the community. A total of £771,618 was raised from residents of the town and the Town Council is fully accountable to residents at the Annual Town Meeting, to be held this year on 13 April 2016 in Cyprus Hall. The cost of Town Council services for a Band D property was £68.34 per year, equating to £1.31 per week. For 2016/17, the Town Council can announce there will be a small increase in the level of charges for the Town Council's element of the council tax. Standing at £69.70 for a Band D property for 2016/17, this is an increase of just over 2.5 pence per week.
