Wowzer Wednesdays Event Report

May 2024

The first Wowzer Wednesday event of 2024 was held in St John's Park on Wednesday 29 May. It was an inflatable extravaganza held in St John's Park, with laser tag, two bouncy castles and an assault course. Places Leisure provided soft play, and Co-Op provided free snacks and drinks for kids. Little Kickers also provided a free football activity. The spend for this event was;

Councilors had a stall and members of the public were all asked to visit the stall before accessing the inflatables. They collected data on the ages of children, as well as the number of adults attending, and where people heard about the event. 582 people attended, of which 369 were children. The ages were broken down into:

Summer 2024

There were then six events in the summer holidays, with events in St John's Park and Church Walk. Previously this had been 5 events, starting on the second Wednesday of the holidays, but this year we launched on the first Wednesday of the holidays, which for some was also the first day of the holidays, with a theatre performance in St John's Park.

This was then followed by circus skills, a magic show, crafts and then Jolf, all on Church Walk. Finishing on the final Wednesday with inflatables in St John's Park. The Co-op were unable to support with fruit for this event, due to a change in process, so we purchased this ourself. The Triangle also ran the soft play area for this date.

We did not collect attendance details for all the summer sessions, as due to the nature of the events, it would not have been possible to collect the data effectively. We did however collect data for the theatre performance and the finale in St John's Park.

The information on the 24th July for the theatre was collected by the team talking to members of the public after they arrived and had seated themselves. It was not possible to talk to everyone, but we collected a snap shot of data. We predicted there was over 400 people in attendance, and collected data for 127 people. This is broken down to:

Evaluation

The Wowzer Wednesday series is always very popular and seems to be drawing people in year on year. Looking at the feedback, there is very little negativity and actually a lot of what was written in the 'It would be even better if...' box was either 'N/a' or 'Nothing'.

Tomfoolery was as popular as ever and we would look to have him again next year, we had wanted to book him for the Christmas event but he was unfortunately unavailable. We would also be looking to increase the number of inflatables we have in both May and at the end of August, as these are very busy events and the spend per child on the inflatables was under £3 a child, which is really good value for money.

The request for chairs seems to be for the magic show, as this was the only time we supplied chairs. We put 20 out which were intended for the use of adult but many children used them. We may look to increase the number of chairs but also supply signage asking they are reserved for adults only.

Overall, the sessions had good turnouts and were received positively.
