

Burgess Hill Christmas Hamper Project

The Christmas Hamper project is an established community project in our town that in 2023 supported 260 families in need, providing a food box that could be collected by a nominating agency, or delivered directly to them. The project is coordinated by the Town Council but is very much a partnership project that has the support of Burgess Hill Community Foodbank; Burgess Hill Youth; The King's Church and Burgess Hill District Lions. The Lions and the Foodbank contribute financially to the project too. This year we are pleased to confirm

the support of Steve Willis Training who have agreed to financially sponsor the Hamper boxes for the next three years. The project team are grateful for their support and secures the project up until 2026.

Folders Meadow Play Area Gets a Revamp

Families and children have something new to smile about as Burgess Hill Town Council announce the installation of brand-new play equipment at Folders Meadow Play Area. This vibrant upgrade promises to provide endless hours, fun and excitement for children up to the age of 14 years old.

The newly installed equipment includes a log pick-up sticks climber, mini target wall & basketball and cableway. There is also a wheelchair accessible seesaw and interactive play panels so children of all abilities can participate in the fun. A dip bar is a welcome addition to the adult green gym equipment.

To celebrate the opening of the revamped play area, Burgess Hill Town Mayor, Councillor Janice

Henwood, along with the Leader of Burgess Hill Town Council, Councillor Peter Williams and fellow Town Councillors, officially opened the new play equipment.

The total budget for these improvements was £45k funded by developer contributions allocated to this play area.

The Town Council maintains Folders Meadow Play Area on behalf of the Fields in Trust, with the last major upgrade in 2012. The Fields in Trust champions and supports parks and green spaces by protecting them for people to enjoy in perpetuity. When visiting Folders Meadow Play Area, please be considerate to neighbouring properties by either walking, cycling, or use public transport to get there.

More Virgin Media Boxes Get a Makeover

More artworks are gracing the streets around Burgess Hill with local artists painting their designs on Virgin Media telecommunication boxes.

Local resident and art teacher Richard Black has painted his design of the 'Old Gasholder', originally opened in 1950 and decommissioned in 2004, on the cabinet on Leylands Road, opposite Lidl.

Local artist Betty Le Bon also painted her rugby themed design on the cabinet at Royal George Road, corner with Denham Road. Her son plays at Burgess Hill Rugby Club.

Burgess Hill Town Council entered an agreement with Virgin Media to give some of their grey telecommunication's boxes around the town a makeover.





A New Initiative by the Leader of Burgess Hill Town Council

When Councillor Peter Williams became Leader of the Town Council in May 2024, he pledged to increase the Council's communication with residents, so as to take away

Burgess Hill Town Council welcomed our new Chief Executive Officer Julie Holden on 17 September.

Moving from East Grinstead Town Council where she has held the position of Clerk for the past 13 years, she stated that she was delighted to move to Burgess Hill and take on the challenge of her home Town Council: "Burgess Hill is a wonderful town, yes, we have our challenges, but when we look to the level of services being delivered at our Town Council with immediate effect to the people who live here, there is a lot to be proud of and I look forward to continuing to develop the services and the work of the Council Team."

Julie has lived in Burgess Hill for 30 years, is married and loves to spend time on walks in the area with her two dogs.

Julie succeeds Steve Cridland who retired at the end of August after 10 years in the role.



Development of Phase 2 of the Burial Ground

The existing burial ground (phase 1), managed by the Town Council, was opened in June 2004 and has provided a respectful and serene final resting place for residents of Burgess Hill. Within the next two to three years, it will start to reach capacity and we are now looking to develop the site immediately adjacent to the existing ground to provide a peaceful and sympathetically designed setting for the next 30 years.

Planning is at the early stage and the Town Council has appointed a consultant to assist with the design layout of this new phase. Costs of the development are estimated to be up to £300k and the Town Council will be seeking a loan from the Public Works Loan Board to fund the project.







Shop Local This Christmas!

Burgess Hill Town Council has launched an annual Shop Local campaign to encourage residents to shop locally this Christmas.



Here at Burgess Hill Town Council, we strongly believe in supporting the town's local businesses and by choosing to shop locally this Christmas, you are showing your support for these businesses, the town's economy and reducing your carbon footprint.

Shop Local is an exciting reward scheme where shoppers using local businesses signed up to the scheme will be entered into a Christmas prize draw. Shoppers can collect a loyalty card and FREE tote bag from Burgess Hill Town Council's Help Point, or one of the participating traders, and can then start collecting stamps whilst shopping across Burgess Hill.

31 shops and businesses within Burgess Hill are participating in the scheme which celebrates the town and its community. When out and about doing their Christmas shopping, customers collect a stamp when they buy something in one of the participating shops. Once they have collected just six stamps, they are entered into a free prize draw to win a host of gifts generously donated by the shops across the town.

The scheme started on Monday 2 September 2024. The prize draw will be made by the Burgess Hill Town Mayor on 20 December 2024, with winners being invited to collect their prizes before Christmas.

New Nature Corridor Scheme to Reconnect Ancient Woodlands

The Lost Woods of the Low Weald and Downs project is calling for landowners to sign-up to a new nature corridor creation scheme, which will help to reconnect ancient woodlands across a 314 sq km area spanning from Lewes to Storrington.

The Woodland Trust-led partnership project is looking for sections of land that can be either planted or left to naturally recolonise with trees and shrubs, which will allow wildlife to move more freely between ancient woodland habitats and boost biodiversity.

Ancient woodlands (woodlands which have existed since 1600) are the richest and most complex habitats in the country. Once vast, they now cover just 2.5% of the UK and are home to more threatened species than any other.

Bob Epsom, Outreach adviser for the Woodland Trust, said: "Over the past century we've lost much of our ancient woodlands in Sussex due to intensive agriculture and expanding development. This project is really exciting as it aims to link some of the pockets of ancient woodlands that are remaining across the Low Weald.

"For landowners, there are so many benefits of getting involved. Trees reduce flooding, prevent soil erosion in farming, and provide shelter and shade for livestock. Hedging creates more homes for wildlife. Together, we can make a real difference to biodiversity levels in the area and help some of our most at-risk species."

Interested landowners will receive free advice on the best way to create wooded habitat on their land, and volunteer help with planting trees or hedges can be arranged.

The Lost Woods team is also supporting landowners with the application process for woodland creation funding, including the Woodland Trust's subsidised MOREwoods and MOREhedges schemes.

The Lost Woods project is made possible with The National Lottery Heritage Fund and is a partnership project between The Woodland Trust, Sussex Wildlife Trust, Small Woods Association and Action in Rural Sussex.

As well as restoring woodlands, the project is offering woodland management training courses, and supporting disadvantaged community groups in Sussex to access nature.

Burgess Hill Choral Society Christmas Concert

Get into the Christmas spirit at Burgess Hill Choral Society's forthcoming concert when we shall be performing Saint-Saëns' moving Christmas *Oratorio* and Chilcott's celebratory *On Christmas Night*. The event includes professional soloists and the choir will be accompanied by South Downs Sinfonia who will also be playing Corelli's *Christmas Concerto*. In addition, there will be carols for choir and audience.

In *On Christmas Night*, Chilcott presents a sequence of eight original carols in which he incorporates traditional melodies within his own settings which results in a work of many moods ranging from reflective to jubilant. He also uses lots of different musical styles, from jazz to folk music.



Saint-Saëns' Christmas *Oratorio* is widely loved for its simple lyrical beauty; it is a work which includes drama as well as gentle passages and leaves listeners with a sense of joy.

Autumn Treats from the BHSO

For their autumn concert on 23 November, the Burgess Hill Symphony Orchestra are offering their loyal audience a number of musical treats.

The concert will open with the well-loved *Hebrides Overture* (also known as "Fingal's Cave") by Felix Mendelssohn. This piece captures the majesty of the hexagonal basalt columns and impressive sea caves on the island of Staffa, as well as the decidedly mixed emotions one might feel while admiring these natural wonders from a small boat on the open sea!

Schumann's joyous *Konzertstück* ("Concert Piece") for Four Horns and Orchestra (Op. 86) features four solo French horns. This piece takes full advantage of the new possibilities offered by the



recently-developed (in 1850) valve horn, which in contrast to the natural horn is fully chromatic. BHSO's own Christopher Newport and Jeanie Teasdale will be joined as soloists by guest players John Peskett and Lizzie Faulkner.

The comic ballet *Pineapple Poll* was written by John Cranko with musical arrangement by Charles Mackerras. It is based on a story written by W.S. Gilbert. All the music is by Sir Arthur Sullivan, and BHSO will be playing a number of these pieces, which we are sure will be familiar to our audience.

César Franck had a long and distinguished career as an organist, teacher and composer, mainly of organ and piano works, in nineteenth century France. This evening we present his only full-length symphony, *Symphony in D minor*. This is a rare chance to hear a piece which was credited with reviving the French symphonic tradition.
