Please take your places quietly, while the Band is playing, to prepare for the service; then stand as the first hymn is played.

During this hymn the Standards and the Book of Remembrance are presented, followed by the preparation of the drumhead altar.

HYMN

- I. O valiant hearts who to your glory came through dust of conflict and through battle flame; tranquil you lie, your knightly virtue proved, your memory hallowed in the land you loved.
- 2. Proudly you gathered, rank on rank, to war as who had heard God's message from afar; all you had hoped for, all you had, you gave, to save mankind yourselves you scorned to save.
- 3. Splendid you passed, the great surrender made; into the light that nevermore shall fade; deep your contentment in that blest abode, who wait the last clear trumpet call of God.
- 4. Long years ago, as earth lay dark and still, rose a loud cry upon a lonely hill, while in the frailty of our human clay, Christ, our Redeemer, passed the self same way.
- 5. Still stands His Cross from that dread hour to this, like some bright star above the dark abyss; still, through the veil, the Victor's pitying eyes look down to bless our lesser Calvaries.
- 6. These were His servants, in His steps they trod, following through death the martyred Son of God: Victor, He rose; victorious too shall rise they who have drunk His cup of sacrifice.

7. O risen Lord, O Shepherd of our dead, whose cross has bought them and Whose staff has led, in glorious hope their proud and sorrowing land commits her children to Thy gracious hand.

BIDDING AND PRAYER OF PENITENCE

Priest: We are here to worship Almighty God, whose purposes are good; whose power sustains the world he has made; who loves us, though we have failed in his service; who gave Jesus Christ for the life of the world; who by his Holy Spirit leads us in his way. As we give thanks for his great works, we remember those who have lived and died in his service and in the service of others.

We pray for all who suffer through war and are in need; and first we ask forgiveness for our many failings in Christian discipleship that we, and all God's people, may be renewed in service and watchfulness for the coming of the Kingdom of righteousness and peace.

All: Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned in thought, word, and deed.

We have not loved you with our whole heart.

We have not loved our neighbours as ourselves. In your mercy, forgive what we have been, help us to amend what we are, and direct what we shall be; that we may do justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with you, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

Priest: Almighty God, have mercy on us, pardon and deliver us from all our sins, confirm and strengthen us in all goodness, and keep us in life eternal.

All: Amen.

HYMN

- I. Dear Lord and Father of mankind, forgive our foolish ways! re-clothe us in our rightful mind, in purer lives thy service find, in deeper reverence praise.
- 2. In simple trust like theirs who heard, beside the Syrian sea, the gracious calling of the Lord, let us, like them, without a word rise up and follow thee.
- 3. O Sabbath rest by Galilee!
 O calm of hills above,
 where Jesus knelt to share with thee
 the silence of eternity,
 interpreted by love!
- 4. Drop thy still dews of quietness, till all our strivings cease; take from our souls the strain and stress, and let our ordered lives confess the beauty of thy peace.
- 5. Breathe through the heats of our desire thy coolness and thy balm; let sense be dumb, let flesh retire; speak through the earthquake, wind, and fire, O still small voce of calm!

THE READINGS

Please sit.

The Bible lessons are read by students from our local schools.

First Reading (Ephesians 2. 13 - 22)

A reading from the Letter to the Ephesians:

But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace; in his flesh he has made both into one and has broken down the dividing wall, that is, the hostility between us, abolishing the law with its commandments and ordinances, that he might create in himself one new humanity in place of the two, thus making peace, and might reconcile both to God in one body through the cross, thus putting to death that hostility through it. So he came and proclaimed peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near, for through him both of us have access in one Spirit to the Father. So then, you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God, built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the cornerstone; in him the whole structure is joined together and grows into a holy temple in the Lord, in whom you also are built together spiritually into a dwelling place for God.

Here ends the first Lesson.

HYMN

I. And did those feet in ancient time walk upon England's mountains green? And was the holy Lamb of God on England's pleasant pastures seen! And did the Countenance Divine, shine forth upon our clouded hills? And was Jerusalem builded here among these dark Satanic Mills?

2. Bring me my bow of burning gold; bring me my arrows of desire: bring me my spear: O clouds, unfold: bring me my chariot of fire. I will not cease from mental fight, nor shall my sword sleep in my hand: till we have built Jerusalem, in England's green and pleasant land.

Second Reading: (St John 15. 9 - 17)

A reading from the Gospel of John.

Jesus said, "As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete."

"This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing, but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. You did not choose me, but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another."

Here ends the second Lesson.

We pray for those who commit these acts of violence, that your light may shine into their darkness and lead them away from violence to live in peace.

Read by a member of the Royal British Legion

Lord God, on this day of remembering, we pray for political leaders.
Give them wisdom and courage.

Guide them so that they may find ways to settle differences by negotiation and diplomacy rather than by threats and the violence of war.

Help people of differing religious and political beliefs of different races and cultures, to see the good in one another and to be more tolerant.

Help us to be peacemakers, that we may be called your sons and daughters.

Lord, in your mercy.

All: Hear our prayer.

Read by a member of the Armed Services

Lord God, on this day of remembering we pray for those who work in places where there is war and violence; for soldiers who must act as peace keepers; for aid workers and agencies providing food and shelter; for doctors, nurses and paramedics who care for the sick, the wounded and the dying.

Guard and defend them and keep them in safety. Bless their work in bringing relief, healing, reconciliation, and peace.
We pray for the Royal British Legion.
Bless its work of help and support for those who have served their country so well.

Read by a member of the Cadet Corps

Lord God, on this day of remembering we thank you for all the brave men and women who gave their lives that we might live in freedom and safety today.

Help us to honour them by committing ourselves to preserve the peace and freedom which they won at such great cost. As we recall their sacrifice, we pray that you will hold them in your love and give them a share in the eternal peace of heaven.

Priest: Let us gather up our prayers as we pray with confidence to the Father in the words our Saviour gave us:

All: Our Father who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name;
Thy kingdom come,

Give us this day our daily bread;
and forgive us our trespasses
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
the power, and the glory,
for ever and ever. Amen.

HYMN

- I. Be still, my soul: the Lord is on your side; bear patiently the cross of grief and pain; leave to your God to order and provide; in ev'ry change, he faithful will remain. be still, my soul: your best, your heav'n-ly friend, through thorny ways, leads to a joyful end.
- 2. Be still, my soul: your God will undertake to guide the future as he has the past. your hope, your confidence let nothing shake, all now mysterious shall be clear at last. be still, my soul: the tempests still obey His voice, who ruled them once on Galilee.

- 3. Be still, my soul: when dearest friends depart, and all is darkened in the veil of tears, then shall you better know His love, His heart, who comes to soothe your sorrow and your fears. be still, my soul: for Jesus can repay from His own fullness all He takes away.
- 4. Be still, my soul: the hour is hastening on when we shall be for ever with the Lord, when disappointment, grief and fear are gone, sorrow forgotten, love's pure joy restored. be still, my soul: when change and tears are past, all safe and blessèd we shall meet at last.
