With Christmas just a few weeks away, Burgess Hill will be buzzing with Christmasthemed events, starting on Friday 22nd November, when members of our Youth Council will be judging the 'Best Dressed Window Competition'. This is a great way of involving our local shops and businesses in a Christmas challenge and by the look of things, they have pulled out all the stops this year. The winner will be notified on the day and will be invited to join the Mayor, on-stage, at the 'It's Christmas!' show on Saturday 23<sup>rd</sup> November.



Every year, we illuminate our town with Christmas lights and at 5pm on Saturday the Mayor, Councillor Janice Henwood, will be joined by the winners of the Mayor's Christmas Card Competition, to press the switch that will power-up the lights.

Prior to that, there will be programme of entertainers on stage, various walkabout performers in the town centre and a rousing march through the town by Burgess Hill Marching Youth. There will also be a number of stalls in Church Walk, featuring food,

craft items, local businesses and much more. The Youth Council will also be there with a stall selling planted bulbs, tree decorations and Christmas cards, all in aid of their chosen charity, the Burgess Hill Pantry.

At the same time as all this is happening, Mid Sussex District Council will have their synthetic skating rink open in the 'Martlets Marquee' each Saturday, Sunday, Thursday and Friday from 23<sup>rd</sup> November to 8<sup>th</sup> December. The Town Council and Burgess Hill Community Crafters Market has jointly organised a Festive Market on Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> December in Church Walk and The Kiln, with stalls selling festive goodies, seasonal gifts, mulled wine, food and lots more. The ever-popular Rock Choir will be performing from 11.00 - 11.45am, followed by the Sussex Harmonisers at 12 noon and 1.00pm. Be assured, Burgess Hill will be dancing in the street, including Councillors!



Now, where is Father Christmas/Santa? He should be around somewhere, surely? Well, I am pleased to say he can be found in his Grotto in the former Gadget shop in the Market Place, every Saturday from 23<sup>rd</sup> November to 14<sup>th</sup> December. When he's not there he will be scurrying (but not seen, of course!) to and from other places in town or leaving his elves to demonstrate how to make toys.
